1 Summary

What

During the review group RG005, and the review of the current IGT UNC drafting, it was identified that the IGT UNC does not effectively point across to the UNC.

Within the 'Re-establishment' process (CIV6.1) there are a number of scenarios and other provisions which have been captured within the UNC but don't appear to have been considered by the IGT UNC for their impact, and therefore do not have the required reference amendments. The UNC additions were made via the Modification process during the period when the work was also being carried out to prepare for Single Service Provision. They should have been captured during the development of the IGT039 modification but were missed at that time. As such under Single Service, the additional Re-establishment processes are already being applied by the CDSP regardless of whether the Supply Point is on a GT network or an IGT network.

Why

The present misalignment between the IGT UNC and the UNC could potentially cause confusion and misinterpretation of the obligations. This change is therefore designed to update and correct this misalignment.

How

While the present clause itself in Part CIV of the IGT UNC points to Re-establishment within the UNC as a whole there are a number of provisions that require updating and inclusion to account for areas not applicable to the IGT UNC requirements.

The proposed legal text therefore accounts for these and the related clause references which need to be pointed to.

2 Governance

Justification for Fast Track Self-Governance Procedures

This change proposal is designed to implement a specific kind of housekeeping change, whereby the IGT UNC is aligned effectively with the UNC. This will have no foreseen impact on parties and therefore does not require extensive review. It is therefore deemed that this change can follow fast track procedures. Likewise, because there is no material impact proposed from this change, it can follow a self-governance approach.

This modification should:

3 Why Change?

The present misalignment between the IGT UNC and the UNC could potentially cause confusion and misinterpretation of the obligations. To ensure that the code is applied effectively a number of updates are required.

While the present clause itself in Part CIV of the IGT UNC points to Re-establishment within the UNC as a whole, and therefore parties to the IGT UNC are bound to the obligations, multiple provision requires updating and inclusion to account for areas not applicable to the IGT UNC requirements.

9 Legal Text

Text Commentary

The below text is from Part CIV of the IGT UNC, version 10.9. The clause in question being 6.1. The new conditions in red are to cover off additional obligations which have been added to the UNC but have not been effectively captured for IGT UNC consideration and required word amendments.

Suggested Text

Re-establishment

For the purposes of Clause 6, the provisions of paragraph 3.7 of Section G of the UNC shall apply with the following changes:

the reference to paragraph 3.5.3 of Section G of the UNC in paragraph G3.7.1 shall be interpreted as a reference to paragraph 3.5.3 as incorporated in this Part CIV by Clause 5.1

the reference to Section H2 of the UNC in paragraph 3.7.3 shall be interpreted as a reference to Section H2 but only to the extent that it applies to the calculation of NDM Supply Meter Point Demand pursuant to Part F

the words "in accordance with the Siteworks Terms and Procedures (as defined in Section G7.2.2)" shall be deleted from paragraph 3.7.4(a)

the words "and Energy Balancing Charges" and "and in respect of Energy Balancing Charges for which the Registered User is liable pursuant to this paragraph 3.7.4(b) a reconciliation will be carried out in accordance with Section E6" shall be deleted from paragraph 3.7.4(b)

the words "and Energy Balancing Charges" shall be deleted from paragraph 3.7.5(b) (i)

the words "in accordance with the Siteworks Terms and Procedures (as defined in Section G7.2.2)" shall be deleted from paragraph 3.7.5 (b) (iii)

paragraph 3.7.5 shall not apply

the reference to "Capacity Charges and Customer Charges" in paragraph 3.7.5(d)(i) shall be interpreted as a reference to "Transportation Charges"

the words "in accordance with Siteworks Terms and Procedures (as defined in Section G7.2.2)" shall be deleted from paragraph 3.7.5(d)(iii)

the words "and Energy Balancing" shall be deleted from paragraph 3.7.7(a)(ii).

the words "in accordance with Siteworks Terms and Procedures (as defined in Section G7.2.2)" shall be deleted from paragraph 3.7.8(a)

the words "and Energy Balancing Charges" and "and in respect of Energy Balancing Charges for which the Registered User is liable pursuant to this paragraph 3.7.4(b) an Offtake Reconciliation will be carried out in accordance with Section E6" shall be deleted from paragraph 3.7.8(b)

the words "and Energy Balancing" shall be deleted from paragraph 3.7.9(b)

the words "NTS Exit Commodity Charges, LDZ Commodity Charges and Commodity Variable Component of Customer Charges in paragraph 3.7.10(a) shall be interpreted as a reference to "Transportation Charges"
