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1 Summary

What

This Modification proposes to make changes to the naming conventions of the tables and processes used in the Annual Quantity (AQ) Review Process.

Why

The AQ Review values implemented annually into the IGT UNC in February have always been correct.

However, a recent review of the supporting information provided to the Workstream and Panel as part of the AQ Review process has led to the discovery that some of the supporting information was not correct and data from the wrong time period had been used for comparison.

The issue was caused by poor naming conventions within the process, and the Modification seeks to address this weakness.

How

This Modification proposes to rename the Connection System Exit Point (CSEP) Network Exit Agreement (NExA) AQ Value tables to provide the year they are relevant to i.e. the AQ Review undertaken in May 2025 will be implemented and take effect from February 2026 till February 2027. The Modification would update the IGT Name section of the NExA AQ Values table to highlight this to be the case.

To ensure clarity is achieved across the board, the Modification also proposes for the 'new' upcoming values, to include the relevant date, for example "[February 2026 – February 2027] Proposed Values", until they have been approved. This will clearly show that they are the figures being proposed.

2 Governance

Justification for Self-Governance procedures

The Modification meets the requirements for Self-Governance, and there are no changes of process for, nor additional governance on, any IGT or Shipper parties.

It will have no material effect on:

- (aa) existing or future gas consumers;
- (bb) competition in the shipping, transportation or supply of gas conveyed through pipes or any commercial activities connected with the shipping, transportation or supply of gas conveyed through pipes;
- (cc) the operation of one or more pipe-line system(s);
- (dd) matters relating to sustainable development, safety or security of supply, or the management of market or network emergencies;
- (ee) the Uniform Network Code governance procedures or the network Code Modification procedures; and is unlikely to discriminate between different classes of parties to the uniform network Code/relevant gas Transporters, gas Shippers or DN operators.

Proposer's requested next steps

This Modification should:

- be subject to self-governance procedures
- proceed to one work group
- proceed to consultation

It would be preferable to have this Modification in place ahead of the next AQ Review Process that takes place in May. This will confirm that a smooth transition is in place for updated documents / templates / names are present from there on, providing clarity that was at present missing.

Workgroup discussions and conclusions (September 2025)

The Workgroup considered the Proposer's justification for Self-Governance. The Code Administrator provided the Workgroup with additional context, advising that the AQ review process currently run by the Independent Networks Association (INA) was not changing but rather the templates used when sending data back to the IGT UNC.

The Workgroup agreed unanimously that IGT179 should be treated as a Self-Governance Modification Proposal.

Initial Panel views (September 2025)

The Panel agreed unanimously that IGT179 should continue be treated as a Self-Governance Modification Proposal.

3 Why Change?

If the changes are not made the issues identified might reoccur in the process or in the interpretation of the data and the consequences could have the same or greater impact.

4 Code Specific Matters

Technical skillsets

General knowledge of the AQ Review Process would be beneficial, but not necessarily needed to understand the Modification being proposed.

5 Solution

NExA Table Reporting Template C2:

The Workgroup agreed unanimously that the solution delivers the intent of the Modification and that no further work is required.

Initial Panel views (September 2025)

The Panel agreed unanimously that no further work was required on the solution.

Workgroup discussions and conclusions (September 2025)

The Panel agreed unanimously that no further work was required with regards to this matter.

Proposer's initial views

Objective (F): Promotion of efficiency in the implementation and administration of the Code.

This Modification could be viewed as a housekeeping change, it looks to update text surrounding the NExA tables, and AQ Review process to provide greater clarity. With this in place, it should promote

efficiency in the implementation and administration of Code as comprehension of the process and tables is made easier to understand.

Workgroup discussions and conclusions (September 2025)

The Workgroup considered the Proposer's views regarding positive impacts on Relevant Objective (F).

The Workgroup agreed unanimously that IGT179 will have a positive impact on Relevant Objective (F), in line with the Proposer's views as set out above.

Initial Panel views (September 2025)

The Panel agreed unanimously that no further work was required with regards to this matter.

8 Implementation

Implementation Approach

The Proposer and the Workgroup recommend the following implementation approach:

- IGT179 is implemented as soon as possible and as part of the next available IGT UNC Release.

Proposer's initial recommendation

The Proposer recommended that the Modification is implemented as soon as possible, this will help establish added clarity with the AQ Review Process, and NExA AQ Tables. This would be for the November release, or the February release at the latest.

As referenced earlier, it would be preferable to have this Modification in place ahead of the next AQ Review Process that takes place in May of each year. This will confirm that a smooth transition is in place for updated documents / templates / names are present from there on, providing clarity that is at present missing.

Workgroup discussions and conclusions (September 2025)

The Workgroup considered the Proposer's initial views on implementation as well as the Code Administrator's suggested implementation approach.

The Code Administrator advised that, due to the 15 Working Day Appeal Window following Panel decision, this Modification would not be able to be included in the November 2025 Release. They confirmed that should the Modification be approved, the next available IGT UNC Release would be the February 2026 Release. The Workgroup noted this.

The Workgroup agreed unanimously with the above implementation approach.

Initial Panel views (September 2025)

The Panel agreed unanimously that no further work was required with regards to this matter.
