1 Summary

What

This Modification seeks to align the IGT UNC definition of the Data Permissions Matrix with the updated UNC definition following [UNC Modification 0921S - Broadening the definition of the Data Permissions Matrix to align with disclosure of UK Link Gemini data](#), which broadens its definition to also include categories of data held in the UK Link Gemini system.

Why

This Modification enables alignment between the IGT UNC and the UNC such that the CDSP may release data related to IGTs as well as GTs if and when appropriate and ensures that definitions between the two Codes remain aligned.

How.

The IGT UNC definition of Data Permissions Matrix will be modified to mirror the updated UNC definition as set out in UNC 0921S.

2 Governance

Justification for Fast Track Self-Governance

Following the implementation of UNC 0921S, there is no material impact from implementing this mirror Modification, which is a housekeeping Modification. Since the revised definition is intended to widen the existing data release permissions definition (Supply Point Register to UK Link) to allow the release of Gemini Data, no impact on IGTs is anticipated.

Requested Next Steps

This Modification should:

- be subject to Fast Track Self-Governance.

Panel discussions and final decision (July 2026)

The Panel considered the Proposer's justification for Fast Track Self-Governance. The Panel reviewed the current Code Provisions for Fast Track Self-Governance and asked the Code Administrator whether the Part L 12.3 requirement to make the Fast Track Self-Governance Modification Proposal available 15 working days ahead of the Panel meeting had been fulfilled. The Code Administrator confirmed that this requirement was fulfilled and there were no objections to the status of Fast Track Self-Governance submitted to the Code Administrator.

The Panel unanimously agreed that this Modification does meet the Fast Track Self-Governance Criteria and should be treated as such.

No prioritisation is needed, reflecting the Ofgem decision to exclude Fast-Track Self-Governance Modifications, as well as Urgent Modifications, from the prioritisation process.

Panel discussions and final decision (July 2026)

The Panel considered the Proposer's views regarding Prioritisation and Code provisions regarding treatment of Fast Track Self-Governance Modifications. The Panel unanimously agreed that this Modification is excluded from the Prioritisation process.

3 Why Change?

UNC 0921S was raised on 9th December 2025. At its August 2025 meeting, the DSC Contract Management Committee approved the Disclosure Request Report (DRR) 'Green Gas Certification Scheme (GGCS) Biomethane Data'. This DRR permits the CDSP to provide Renewable Energy Assurance Limited (REA) with data held in UK Link Gemini; specifically, allocated volumes of biomethane gas injected. The data will be used to complete plausibility checks when issuing Green Gas Certificates and to support external audits of the scheme.

The UNC definition of the Data Permissions Matrix (within UNC General Terms Section D) refers exclusively to categories of data maintained in the Supply Point Register. UNC 0921S therefore seeks to broaden this definition, to align with the release of UK Link Gemini data through this DRR.

This IGT UNC Modification has been raised to update the IGT UNC definition of Data Permissions Matrix to avoid any uncertainty regarding the release of data in the case of biomethane entry via an IGT.

We propose that the words “the Supply Point Register” within the definition of Data Permissions Matrix be replaced with “UK Link” to mirror the changes to the UNC definition proposed by UNC 0921S.

Panel discussions and final decisions (July 2026)

The Panel considered the Proposer's views against the Objectives and unanimously agreed that this Modification will have a positive impact on Objective (F) for the reasons set out by the Proposer.

8 Implementation

Recommended implementation approach

Proposer submitted this Modification with a recommendation that it be implemented on the same day, or as soon as possible following, the implementation of UNC 0921S.

The Code Administrator proposes an implementation date of 1 Working Day following the closer of the 15 Working Day Appeal Window as UNC0921 has already been implemented.

Panel discussions and final decisions (July 2026)

The Code Administrator advised the Panel that related UNC Modification 0921S has already been implemented. They noted the Proposer's request that IGT182 be implemented as soon as possible after the implementation of the UNC Modification. The Code Administrator recommended an implementation date of 1 Working Day following the closure of the 15 Working Day Appeal Window. Which would make the implementation date 23rd July 2026.

The Panel considered the Proposer and Code Administrator views regarding implementation. The Panel unanimously agreed that this Modification should be implemented 1 Working Day following the closure of the 15 Working Day Appeal Window.
